SHOW REGULATIONS

Dyfed Carrage Club would like to express their sincere gratitude to the Picton Castle Trust, the Philipps family, the staff of Picton Castle Gardens and Mrs Sue Warner for their gracious support of this event.

We extend a warm welcome members of the Equestrian franternity to our very special event. Whilst we endeavour to make the event as safe and as enjoyable as possible for everyone, we would kindly request you observe our regulations:

- All participants have a duty of care to be safe as possible and conduct themselves in an appropriate manner for themselves and those around them at all times at this event.
- It is required that all competitors are protected with cover for third party insurance. This can be through Societies such as BDS. BHS etc or their own household insurance.
- Neither the organising committee of the event, nor the Dyfed Carriage Club, nor Picton Castle Trust, nor any Land Owner, Agent, Employee or representative of these bodies accept any Liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to any animal, person or property whatsoever however caused.
- The Dyfed Carriage Club will not be responsible for any entry made in the wrong class.
- · Dogs must be on leads at all times. Children must be the responsibility of the accompanying adults.
- The Dyfed Carriage Club reserve the right to cancel any class, refunding any fees in respect thereof, otherwise fees will not be refunded
- The Dyfed Carriage Club reserves the right to change the judge without warning and to amalgamate or divide any class
- It is the responsibility of all owners and exhibitors to prevent the spread of any infectious diseases and take all
 necessary precautions. Owners of all equines are advised to vaccinate against equine influenza.
- The Show Committee cannot be held responsible for classes clashing
- The Dyfed Carriage Club reserve the right to reject or cancel any entry if they deem it fit to do. Any exhibitor making
 an entry shall deem to accept and shall abide by these rules. The decision of the organising committee shall be final.
- Winners of trophies shall return them by registered and compensated post or by hand to the Cup Secretary/Secretary
 at the monthly meeting one month before the date of the next show, in a clean and undamaged condition and if a
 shield with blank plates, shall be responsible for having it appropriately engraved. Loss or damage to trophies is the
 responsibility of the holder.
- The decision of the Judges shall be final.

EIDCT AID

- Objections must be made in writing to the Secretary accompanied by £20 within half an hour of the occurrence, which may, at the discretion of the show committee, be forfeited to the funds of the Club if the objection is disallowed.
- Ridden and driven horses and ponies must be 4 years old or over, unless otherwise stated. In the interests of safety,
 any competing colts or stallions will only be accepted if the owner can assure their good behaviour. No child under the
 age of 14 can compete with/drive a stallion.
- All competitors will be expected to be smartly and appropriately attired. No competitor will be allowed in the ring for
 any showing class unless correctly dressed.
- Competitors must check the at the Show Secretary tent on the Show Day for alterations. Any changes will be broadcast. Any advance changes will be posted on the club website www.dyfedcarriageclub.co.uk
- All equines must proceed at walk in the horse park and any public or crowded area. Any schooling, working in, warming
 up, lunging mut be done safely away fom the rest of other participants. No cantering behind the back of horseboxes as
 this may unsettle other participants
- Anyone riding a pony/horse at anytime MUST wear protective headgear.
- The Referee or Secretary appointed for the day will act as Disciplinary Steward and will penalise any person guilty of
 dangerous riding or driving, misuse of the whip or ill treatment of a pony/horse, conducting themselves in a manner
 which is offensive to the public.
- In the interest of public safety, no horses or ponies should be left tied unattended to the outside of a
 horsebox. Anyone found contravening this rule will be imediately asked to leave the showground.

FIKST AID	A trained first aider will be in attendance. Any emergencies will be refereed to the load. A& E at Withybush Hospital
FARRIER	A registered farrier will be in attendance/on call Details will be available from the Stable Foreman. Exhibitors are responsible for cost of individual farrier services.
VET	Arrangements have been made with the nearest veterinary surgeons who will be on standby for the event Cotts Equine tel: 01834 860871 Exhibitors are responsible for cost of individual veterinary treatment.
LIVERY	In addition to the onsite stabling, we can recommend local livery yards for overnight stabling. Advance booking is recommended

In-Hand and Ridden Showing Classes (Saturday 25 June)

Rosettes to 6th Place

Entry fee: £10 per class (entry does NOT include access to the Castle Gardens)

H6. In-Hand Coloured Horse or Pony - Open to any coloured horse or pony to be shown inhand. Special awards for highest placed Traditional Coloured and Coloured Sporthorse type

H7. In-Hand World and Rare Breed Horse or Pony - Open to any purebred rare or world breed of horse or pony to be shown in-hand.

H8. In-Hand Native Breed Horse or Pony - Open to any British Native breed of horse or pony to be shown in-hand.

C2. In-Hand Championship - Open to first prize winners in in-hand classes

H9. Ridden Concours d'Élégance & Iberian Parade Horse. Open to any ridden (excluding Sidesaddle) horse or pony 4 years old and over in traditional costume (excluding fancy dress). Entries in this class are invited to display in front of the castle after their class at about 4.00pm (time is subject to change but will be advised) Includes entry to Castle Gardens with writband*

H10. Ridden Coloured Horse or Pony - Open to any coloured horse or pony to be shown under saddle. Special awards for highest placed Traditional Coloured and Coloured Sporthorse type

H11. Ridden World and Rare Breed Horse or Pony - Open to any purebred world and rare breed of horse or pony 4 year old and over to be shown under saddle.

H12. Ridden Native Breed Horse or Pony - Open to any British Native breed of horse or pony 4 year old and over to be shown under saddle.

C3. Ridden Championships - open to first prize winners in Ridden Classes

Rosettes to 6th Place

Entry fee: £5 per class (entry does NOT include access to the Castle Gardens)

H13. In-Hand Veteran Horse or Pony - Open to any Veteran horse or ponyover the age of 16 to be shown in-hand. Special award to the oldest horse or pony

H14. Best Child handler - Open to any suitable horse or pony to be shown in-hand led by a child. Class split for 6-10, 11-13 and 13-16 years old. Wearing of hard hats is mandatory. Competitors to display their ability to handle a quiet pony.

H15. Ridden Veteran Horse or Pony - Open to any Veteran horse or ponyover the age of 16 to be shown under saddle. Special award to the oldest horse or pony

H16. Best horse and rider - Open to any suitable horse or pony to be shown under saddle. Class split for junior, teenager, adult, veteran. Wearing of hard hats is mandatory.

H17. Best Fancy Dress including the Thelwell Challenge - Open to any suitable horse or pony to be shown in fancy dress.

Side Saddle Classes...

Side Saddle classes are affiliated to the Side Saddle Association.

Entry fee: £10 per class (entry does NOT include access to the Castle Gardens except for 2 attendants for

display classes)

H1. Sidesaddle Equitation Championships Open Qualifying Class

Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Member's Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. Southernden Farm offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. Side Saddle International offer a rosette to the Adult Member and Manor Grange Stud Show Centre to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out.

H2. Sidesaddle Classical Ladies - Open to SSA Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding side saddle, on horses exceeding 148cms (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners & way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider, by a SHBGB, BSHA, BSPS, P(UK) or SSA Panel Judge, Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits; horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted. N.B. Silk hats are permitted to be worn in this class AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY. Judges are requested to use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. Special rosettes are offered by Mrs. T. Mitchell to the winner and if the winner has already qualified, a second rosette is awarded with the Qualification Card. Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only. The highest placed Riding Horse, Hack (not exceeding 160cm), Cob or Hunter, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, ridden by a SSA Adult Member qualifies for The 2015 BSHA Championship Show Total Impact Equestrian Ladies Show Horse Championship and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5th place. The qualification period is 1st January, 2015 to 11th September, 2015. SSA Members who qualify for The Ladies Show Horse Championship, will not be required to join the BSHA in order to compete in any Side Saddle class at the BSHA National Championship Show. If the BSHA Championship Show entries have closed at the time of qualification, competitors will not be charged a late entry fee for the Championship.

H3 Sidesaddle Concours d'Élégance - The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance but detailed inspection of rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the Judge may ask groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. 4 Special rosettes will be awarded to the highest placed Adult Members wearing a silk hat, bowler hat, safety hat and the highest placed Junior Member of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. N.B. Silk hats are permitted to be worn by Adults IN THIS CLASS AT ANY TIME OF DAY. Juniors must wear hats to current British Safety standards or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.

H4. Side Saddle Costume Concours d'Élégance - PLEASE NOTE. The class will be judged in the Grand Arena followed immediately after by a display in the front of the Castle in the Castle Arena.


The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony and rider, and the way of going of the horse/pony. Safe tack must be used. Detailed inspection of the rider's period costume is not required. Fancy dress is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the judge may ask small groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. 2 Special rosettes to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Card. Competitors should produce a brief résumé about their costumes for the Commentator. Juniors must wear hats to current British Safety standards or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.

Please Note: Entry to the Sidesaddle classes includes access to the Castle Gardens for display classes. Wristbands will be issued to a maximum of 2 attendants by the Stable Foreman and must be worn as proof.

LOCATION

Picton Castle is in the heart of rural Pembrokeshire and is easily accessable from the M4 and A40. It is approx 2 hours from Severn Bridge and clearly marked off the A40 with large roadsigns. Access is suitable for very large horseboxes.
